Some Important Points to remember about Ummayad and Abbasid Caliphates

Umayyad Caliphate	Abbasid Caliphate
Umayyad dynasty , also spelled Omayyad , the first great Muslim <u>dynasty</u> to rule the <u>empire</u> of the <u>caliphate</u> (661–750 CE), sometimes referred to as the <u>Arab</u> kingdom	Abbasid caliphate, second of the two great <u>dynasties</u> of the <u>Muslim empire</u> of the <u>caliphate</u> . It overthrew the <u>Umayyad</u> caliphate in 750 CE and reigned as the Abbasid caliphate until it was destroyed by the <u>Mongol</u> invasion in 1258.
Umayyad rule was divided between two branches of the family: the Sufyānids (reigned 661–684), descendants of Abū Sufyān; and the <u>Marwanids</u> (reigned 684–750)	Hārūn al-Rashīd, in full Hārūn al-Rashīd ibn Muḥammad al-Mahdī ibn al-Manṣūr al-ʿAbbāsī, (born February 766/March 763, <u>Rayy</u> , Iran—died March 24, 809, Ṭūs), fifth <u>caliph</u> of the ʿAbbāsid dynasty (786– 809), who ruled <u>Islam</u> at the zenith of its empire with a luxury in <u>Baghdad</u> memorialized in <u>The Thousand</u> and One Nights (The Arabian Nights Entertainment).
